

One thing which might be of interest is the original teletex message in which the Durham Light Infantry stationed at Brancepeth Castle (1939 -1962) learnt of the ceasefire the day before the news was released to the general public.

Below is a copy of the original message. Unfortunately, it is not easy to read, I think if they had known what was coming they would have put a new ribbon in their Teletext machine.

DUE TO DIFFICULTIES OF COMNS TIERE MAY BE SOME DELAY IN SIMILAR ORDERS REACHING ENEMY . TIS. SO, FULL DEF FRECAUTIONS VILL BE TAKEN (.) NO. REPEAT NO RELEASE VILL BE MADE TO THE PRESS PENDING AN ANNOUNCEMENT E'' THE HEADS OF HE THE GOVERNMENTS UNQUOTE (.) ALL INFM
